2015 Regular Session 2015-A Special Session *Legislative Wrap-Up Report* 

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The following bills were passed by the Legislature and were sent to the Governor for his action. All information is as of June 30, 2015. To view bill language, click on the bill number.

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### Substantive Bills

## The following is an overview of substantive bills of interest to the Department of Corrections passed by the Florida Legislature during the 2015 Regular Legislative Session.

#### HB 0005 – Relating to Relating to Guardianship Proceedings Ch. 2015-83 Laws of Florida Approved by the Governor on June 2, 2015

The bill amends statutory language by:

- Requiring the filing of motions in terminations or suspensions of power of attorney in incapacity or guardianship proceedings;
- Authorizing a court to appoint office of criminal conflict & civil regional counsel as court monitor in guardianship proceedings;
- Authorizing court to appoint guardian ad litem to protect minor's interests;
- Providing for confidentiality in settlement of minor's claim;
- Requiring the notification of an incapacitated person & attorney before the appointment of an emergency temporary guardian;
- Providing for compensation of examining committee if the petition for incapacity is dismissed;
- Providing for the appointment of emergency temporary guardian;
- Providing that a business entity may act as guardian;
- Requiring reporting of incidents of abuse, neglect, & exploitation of ward by guardian.

#### Effective Date: July 1, 2015

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#### HB 0021 – Relating to Substance Abuse Services Ch. 2015-100 Laws of Florida Approved by the Governor on June 10, 2015

- Requiring Department of Children and Families (DCF) to create voluntary certification programs for recovery residences;
- Requiring DCF to approve credentialing entities to develop & administer certification program;
- Requiring background screenings of recovery residence employees;
- Providing for the denial, suspension, or revocations of certification;
- Directing DCF to approve at least one credentialing entity by specified date to develop & administer certification programs;
- Requiring DCF to publish the list on its website.



#### HB 0027 – Relating to Driver Licenses & Identification Cards <u>Ch. 2015-85</u> Laws of Florida Approved by the Governor on June 2, 2015

The bill amends statutory language by:

- Allowing the Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles to accept military identification card to meet certain requirements for issuance of driver license or identification card;
- Authorizing the word "Veteran" to be exhibited on a driver license or identification card of a veteran.

Effective Date: July 1, 2015

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#### HB 0079 – Relating to Crisis Stabilization Services Ch. 2015-102 Laws of Florida Approved by the Governor on June 10, 2015

The bill amends statutory language by:

- Requiring DCF to develop standards and protocols for collection, storage, transmittal, & analysis of utilization data from public receiving facilities;
- Requiring compliance by managing entities by specified date;
- Requiring DCF to create a statewide database.

Effective Date: June 10, 2015

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#### HB 0115 – Relating to Sentencing Ch. 2015-132 Laws of Florida Approved by the Governor on June 11, 2015

The bill amends statutory language by:

- Redefining "victim" for purposes of restitution provisions to include governmental entities & political subdivisions;
- Requiring the sentencing judge to order restitution & specified number of community service work hours for violations of provisions relating to bribery & misuse of public office & offenses by public officers & employees.

#### Effective Date: October 1, 2015



#### HB 0157– Relating to Fraud Ch. 2015-166 Laws of Florida Approved by the Governor on June 16, 2015

The bill amends statutory language by:

- Defining "business entity";
- Providing for restitution for certain out-of-pocket costs of victims;
- Requiring business entities to provide copies of business records of fraudulent transactions involving identity theft to victims & law enforcement agencies in certain circumstances;
- Providing exception;
- Including counties & other political subdivisions in provisions prohibiting false marking of goods or packaging with location of origin;
- Prohibiting fraudulent issuance of indicia of membership interest in limited liability company;
- Specifying that electronic statements are included in provisions prohibiting certain false representations;
- Prohibiting the sale of counterfeit security company signs or decals;
- Increasing criminal penalties for fraudulently obtaining goods or services from health care provider;
- Expanding specified identity theft offenses to include all persons rather than being limited to natural persons;
- Prohibiting knowingly providing false information that becomes part of public record to facilitate or further commission of certain offenses.

#### Effective Date: October 1, 2015

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#### HB 0197 – Relating to Tracking Devices or Tracking Applications <u>Ch. 2015-137</u> Laws of Florida Approved by the Governor on June 11, 2015

- Prohibiting the installation of tracking devices or tracking applications without a person's consent;
- Creating the presumption that consent is revoked upon initiation of specified proceedings;
- Providing exceptions;
- Providing that violations of prohibition on the installations of tracking devices & tracking applications by private investigative, private security, & repossession services are grounds for disciplinary action, to which penalties apply.



#### Effective Date: October 1, 2015

#### HB 0201 – Relating to Diabetes Awareness Training for Law Enforcement Officers <u>Ch. 2015-168</u> Laws of Florida Approved by the Governor on June 16, 2015

The bill amends statutory language by:

- Designating this act as the "Arthur Green, Jr., Act";
- Requiring the Florida Department of Law Enforcement to establish an online continued employment training components relating to diabetic emergencies;
- Specifying topics to be included;
- Providing that completion of training may count towards continued employment instruction requirements.

#### Effective Date: October 1, 2015

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#### HB 0225 – Relating to All-American Flag Act Ch. 2015-138 Laws of Florida Approved by the Governor on June 11, 2015

The bill amends statutory language by:

- Designating this act as the "All-American Flag Act";
- Requiring the U.S. flag or state flag that is purchased on or after specified date by the state, county, or municipality for public use be made in the U.S.

Effective Date: July 1, 2015

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#### <u>SB 0228</u> – Relating to Online Voter Application <u>Ch. 2015-36</u> Laws of Florida Approved by the Governor on May 15, 2015

- Requiring the Division of Elections of the Department of State to develop an online voter registration system;
- Requiring the system to compare information submitted online with Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles records;
- Requiring the division to report to the Legislature regarding online voter registration implementation by a specified date, etc.



#### <u>SB 0248</u> – Relating to Public Records/Body Camera Recording Made by a Law Enforcement Officer <u>Ch. 2015-41</u> Laws of Florida Approved by the Governor on May 21, 2015

The bill amends statutory language by:

- Providing that a body camera recording is confidential and exempt from public records requirements under certain circumstances;
- Providing exceptions;
- Requiring a law enforcement agency to retain body camera recordings for at least a specified period;
- Providing for retroactive application;
- Providing for future legislative review and repeal of the exemption;
- Providing a statement of public necessity, etc.

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Effective Date: July 1, 2015

#### <u>SB 0290</u> – Relating to Carrying a Concealed Weapon or a Concealed Firearm <u>Ch. 2015-44</u> Laws of Florida Approved by the Governor on May 21, 2015

The bill amends statutory language by:

• Providing an exemption from criminal penalties for carrying a concealed weapon or a concealed firearm when evacuating pursuant to a mandatory evacuation order during a declared state of emergency, etc.

Effective Date: May 21, 2015

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#### HB 0321 – Relating to HIV Testing Ch. 2015-110 Laws of Florida Approved by the Governor on June 10, 2015

- Revising & providing definitions;
- Specifying notification & consent procedures for performing HIV tests in health care & non-health care settings.



#### HB 0335 – Relating to Psychiatric Nurses Ch. 2015-111 Laws of Florida Approved by the Governor on June 10, 2015

The bill amends statutory language by:

- Requiring psychiatric nurses to hold national advanced practice certification as psychiatric mental health advanced practice nurse;
- Authorizing such nurses to approve releases of individuals from the receiving facility after involuntary examination under certain circumstances.

Effective Date: July 1, 2015

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#### HB 0342 – Relating to No Contact Orders Ch. 2015-17 Laws of Florida Approved by the Governor on May 14, 2015

The bill amends statutory language by:

- Providing for the effect and enforceability of orders of no contact as a part of pretrial release;
- Requiring that the defendant receive a copy of the order of no contact prior to release;
- Specifying acts prohibited by a no contact order, etc.

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#### Effective Date: October 1, 2015

<u>SB 0378</u> – Relating to Juvenile Justice <u>Ch. 2015-46</u> Laws of Florida Approved by the Governor on May 21, 2015

- Authorizing a law enforcement officer to issue a warning to a juvenile who admits having committed a misdemeanor or to inform the child's parent or guardian of the child's infraction;
- Allowing a law enforcement officer who does not exercise one of these options to issue a civil citation or require participation in a similar diversion program;



• Requiring a law enforcement officer to provide written documentation in certain circumstances, etc.

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Effective Date: October 1, 2015

#### HB 0439 – Relating to Department of Legal Affairs Ch. 2015-92 Laws of Florida Approved by the Governor on June 2, 2015

The bill amends statutory language by:

- Revising the list of offenses that may be investigated and prosecuted by the Office of Statewide Prosecution;
- Prohibiting bad faith assertions of patent infringement from being made;
- Revising the conditions under which elderly persons or disabled adults who suffer a property loss are eligible for an award;
- Providing for relocation assistance for human trafficking victims, etc.

Effective Date: July 1, 2015

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#### HB 0465 – Relating to Human Trafficking Ch. 2015-145 Laws of Florida Approved by the Governor on June 11, 2015

The bill amends statutory language by:

- Providing enhanced criminal penalties for soliciting another to commit prostitution & similar offenses;
- Requiring persons convicted of such offenses to perform community service & pay for & attend education program;
- Requiring court to impose minimum mandatory terms of incarceration for persons convicted two or more times of soliciting another to commit prostitution & similar offenses;
- Providing for impoundment of vehicle used in soliciting another to commit prostitution & similar offenses;
- Allowing vehicle owners to prevent impoundment or immobilization in certain circumstances;
- Allowing any court in circuit in which the petitioner was arrested to expunge criminal history record of human trafficking victim;
- Requiring judges to allow advocates to be present with in expunction hearing in certain circumstances.

#### Effective Date: October 1, 2015



#### <u>SB 0526</u> – Relating to Notaries Public <u>Ch. 2015-23</u> Laws of Florida Approved by the Governor on May 14, 2015

The bill amends statutory language by:

- Revising the methods available for verifying documents;
- Providing an exception to the requirement that a signer personally appear before a notary public at the time of notarization;
- Defining the term reliable electronic means;
- Authorizing specified officers to administer oaths by reliable electronic means when engaged in the performance of official duties, etc.

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Effective Date: July 1, 2015

#### <u>SB 0570</u> – Relating to Service of Process of Witness Subpoenas <u>Ch. 2015-51</u> Laws of Florida Approved by the Governor on May 21, 2015

The bill amends statutory language by:

• Providing that service of a subpoena on a witness in a civil traffic case may be made by United States mail directed to the witness at the last known address and that such service must be mailed before a specified period, etc.

Effective Date: July 1, 2015

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#### <u>SB 0620</u> – Relating to Emergency Management <u>Ch. 2015-55</u> Laws of Florida Approved by the Governor on May 21, 2015

The bill amends statutory language by:

• Exempting certain employees from specified travel expense provisions when traveling under the Emergency Management Assistance Compact under certain circumstances, etc.

Effective Date: May 21, 2015

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<u>SB 0672</u> – Relating to Service of Process <u>Ch. 2015-59</u> Laws of Florida Approved by the Governor on May 21, 2015



The bill amends statutory language by:

• Authorizing a criminal witness subpoena commanding a witness to appear for a deposition to be posted at the witness's residence by an authorized person if one attempt to serve the subpoena has failed, etc.

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#### Effective Date: July 1, 2015

#### <u>SB 0766</u>– Relating to Surveillance by a Drone <u>Ch. 2015-26</u> Laws of Florida Approved by the Governor on May 14, 2015

The bill amends statutory language by:

- Prohibiting a person, a state agency, or a political subdivision from using a drone to capture an image of privately owned real property or of the owner, tenant, occupant, invitee, or licensee of such property with the intent to conduct surveillance without his or her written consent if a reasonable expectation of privacy exists;
- Authorizing the use of a drone by a person or entity engaged in a business or profession licensed by the state in certain circumstances, etc.

Effective Date: July 1, 2015

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#### HB 0889– Relating to Health Care Representatives Ch. 2015-153 Laws of Florida Approved by the Governor on June 11, 2015

The bill amends statutory language by:

- Providing an exception for a patient who has designated a surrogate to make health care decisions and receive health information without a determination of incapacity being required;
- Revising provisions relating to the designation of health care surrogates;
- Providing for the designation of health care surrogates for minors;
- Specifying that a principal's wishes are controlling while he or she has decision making capacity, etc.

#### Effective Date: October 1, 2015



#### <u>SB 1010</u>– Relating to False Personation <u>Ch. 2015-29</u> Laws of Florida Approved by the Governor on May 14, 2015

The bill amends statutory language by:

- Revising the list of officials who are prohibited from being falsely personated;
- Prohibiting the sale or transfer of specified badges bearing in any manner or combination the words fire department and the ownership or operation of vehicles marked or identified by the words fire department, etc.

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#### Effective Date: October 1, 2015

#### HB 1069 – Relating to Defendants in Specialized Courts Ch. 2015-178 Laws of Florida Approved by the Governor on June 16, 2015

The bill amends statutory language by:

• Requiring trial court to transfer certain criminal cases involving participants in specified programs to another jurisdiction having such program under certain conditions.

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Effective Date: July 1, 2015

#### <u>HB 7001</u>– Relating to Intercepting and Recording Oral Communications <u>Ch. 2015-82</u> Laws of Florida Approved by the Governor on May 22, 2015

The bill amends statutory language by:

• Authorizing a child younger than 18 years of age to intercept and record an oral communication if the child is a party to the communication and certain conditions are met, etc.

Effective Date: July 1, 2015

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#### HB 7019 – Relating to Workforce Services Ch. 2015-98 Laws of Florida Approved by the Governor on June 2, 2015

The bill amends statutory language by:

• Renaming Workforce Florida, Inc., as CareerSource Florida, Inc.;



- Creating task force on preparation for state's implementation of federal Workforce Innovation & Opportunity Act;
- Providing membership & duties of task force;
- Requiring task force to submit report & recommendations for approval by CareerSource Florida, Inc.;
- Requiring CareerSource Florida, Inc., to submit specified state plan to USDOL;
- Providing for abolishment of task force.

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#### Effective Date: June 2, 2015

#### <u>SB 7028</u> – Relating to Educational Opportunities for Veterans <u>Ch. 2015-76</u> Laws of Florida Approved by the Governor on May 14, 2015

The bill amends statutory language by:

- Revising criteria for eligibility for out-of-state fee waivers at state universities, Florida College System institutions, and specified career centers;
- Removing a provision regarding the applicability of waivers to required credit hours for a student's degree or certificate program, etc.

Effective Date: May 21, 2015

#### <u>HB 7061</u> – Relating to Public Records/ Florida RICO Act <u>Ch. 2015-99</u> Laws of Florida Approved by the Governor on June 2, 2015

The bill amends statutory language by:

- Providing an exemption from public records requirements for certain documents and information held by an investigative agency pursuant to an investigation relating to an activity prohibited under the Florida RICO Act;
- Authorizing disclosure of such documents and information under certain conditions;
- Providing for future legislative review and repeal of the exemption;
- Providing a statement of public necessity, etc.

#### <u>SB 2500-A</u> – General Appropriations Act <u>Ch. 2015-232</u> Laws of Florida Approved by the Governor with Vetoes on June 23, 2015

#### Major funding decisions:

The funding for the Department of Corrections totals over \$2.35 billion.

- \$10M total funds for Fixed Capital Outlay projects \$7.3M for repairs and maintenance and \$2.7M for the new/expanded medical facility at Union CI.
- \$16.4M to fund operational deficits across the Department.
- \$2.25M total funds for the acquisition of motor vehicles \$750K for the replacement of community corrections vehicles and \$1.5M to replace transport vehicles.
- \$11M to fund the food service contract and religious dietary program.
- \$2.21M total funds for residential treatment programming \$625K for a co-occurring mental health and substance abuse pilot in Miami-Dade county and \$1.59M for additional community corrections residential substance abuse treatment.
- \$1.3M for electronic monitoring including funds to pilot 3 work release centers.
- \$1.3M to upgrade the Department to Microsoft 365 as well as expand email use to all members.
- \$500K for officer certification and training.

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<u>SB 2502-A</u> – Implementing the General Appropriations Act <u>Ch. 2015-222</u> Laws of Florida Approved by the Governor with Vetoes on June 23, 2015

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## ADMINISTRATIVE BILLS

# The following is an overview of administrative bills of interest to the Department of Corrections passed by the Florida Legislature during the 2015 Regular and Special 2015-A Legislative Session.

#### HB 0329– Relating to Special License Plates Ch. 2015-91 Laws of Florida Approved by the Governor on June 2, 2015

The bill amends statutory language by:

- Authorizing the Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles to issue Women Veteran, World War II Veteran, Navy Submariner, Combat Action Ribbon, Air Force Combat Action Medal, and Distinguished Flying Cross license plates;
- Specifying qualifications and requirements for the plates;
- Requiring that any revenue generated from the sale of Women Veteran license plates be deposited into the Operations and Maintenance Trust Fund to be used for certain purposes, etc.

Effective Date: July 1, 2015

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#### HB 0369– Relating to Human Trafficking Ch. 2015-172 Laws of Florida Approved by the Governor on June 16, 2015

The bill amends statutory language by:

- Requiring the Department of Transportation, the Department of Health, and certain employers to display human trafficking public awareness signs at specified locations;
- Providing public awareness sign requirements;
- Authorizing a county commission to adopt an enforcement ordinance;
- Providing a penalty, etc.

Effective Date: January 1, 2016

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#### HB 0371 – Relating to Agency Inspectors General Ch. 2015-173 Laws of Florida Approved by the Governor on June 16, 2015



- Providing additional hiring requirements, employment qualifications, & terms of employment for inspectors general & staff;
- Establishing duty of specified persons & entities with respect to inspector general's duties;
- Requiring contracts & other specified documents to contain certain statement regarding inspector general's duties;
- Authorizing the Chief Inspector General to retain legal counsel & issue & enforce subpoenas.

#### Effective Date: July 1, 2015

#### HB 0435 – Relating to Administrative Procedures Ch. 2015 Laws of Florida VETOED on June 16, 2015

The bill amends statutory language by:

- Providing procedures for agencies to follow when initiating rulemaking after certain public hearings;
- Limiting reliance upon an unadopted rule in certain circumstances;
- Providing for publication of notices of rule development and of rules filed for adoption;
- Conforming proceedings that oppose agency action based on an invalid or unadopted rule to proceedings used for challenging rules, etc.

Effective Date: July 1, 2015

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#### <u>HB 0467</u> – Relating to Public Records/Human Trafficking Victims <u>Ch. 2015-146</u> Laws of Florida Approved by the Governor on June 11, 2015

- Revising exemptions from public records requirements for certain criminal intelligence & investigative information to exempt information that reveals identity of victims of certain human trafficking offenses;
- Providing exemptions from public records requirements for investigative information relating to criminal history records of human trafficking victims that have been ordered to be expunged;
- Providing for future legislative review & repeal of exemptions;
- Providing a statement of public necessity;
- Providing for contingent effect.



#### HB 0469 – Relating to Public Records/Residential Facilities Serving Victims of Sexual Exploitation <u>Ch. 2015-147</u> Laws of Florida Approved by the Governor on June 11, 2015

The bill amends statutory language by:

- Providing an exemption from public records requirements for information about location of safe houses, safe foster homes, & other residential facilities serving victims of sexual exploitation held by an agency;
- Providing an exemption from public records requirements for information about location of residential facilities serving adult victims of human trafficking involving commercial sexual activity held by an agency;
- Providing for future legislative review & repeal of exemptions;
- Providing a statement of public necessity;
- Providing a contingent effective date.

Effective Date: October 1, 2015

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#### HB 0565 – Relating to Retirement Ch. 2015-149 Laws of Florida Approved by the Governor on June 11, 2015

The bill amends statutory language by:

- Authorizing local agency employers to reassess designation of positions for inclusion in SMS Class;
- Providing for removal of certain positions.

Effective Date: July 1, 2015

#### <u>SB 0694</u> – Relating to Florida State Employees' Charitable Campaign <u>Ch. 2015-61</u> Laws of Florida Approved by the Governor on May 21, 2015



- Providing an exception to the requirement that state officers and employees designate a charitable organization to receive their contributions from the Florida State Employees Charitable Campaign;
- Requiring the fiscal agent selected by the Department of Management Services to distribute undesignated funds in a specified manner, etc.

Effective Date: July 1, 2015

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#### <u>SB 0702</u> – Relating to Florida Statutes <u>Ch. 2015-2</u> Laws of Florida Approved by the Governor on March 19, 2015

The bill amends statutory language by:

- Deleting provisions that have expired, have become obsolete, have had their effect, have served their purpose, or have been impliedly repealed or superseded;
- Replacing incorrect cross-references and citations;
- Correcting grammatical, typographical, and like errors;
- Removing inconsistencies, redundancies, and unnecessary repetition in the statutes;
- Improving the clarity of the statutes and facilitating their correct interpretation;
- Confirming the restoration of provisions unintentionally omitted from republication in the acts of the Legislature during the amendatory process, etc.

#### Effective Date: June 30, 2015

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#### <u>SB 0982</u> – Relating to Florida Civil Rights Act <u>Ch. 2015-68</u> Laws of Florida Approved by the Governor on June 2, 2015

The bill amends statutory language by:

- Prohibiting discrimination on the basis of pregnancy in public lodging and food service establishments and places of public accommodation;
- Prohibiting employment discrimination on the basis of pregnancy;
- Prohibiting discrimination on the basis of pregnancy by labor organizations, joint labormanagement committees, employment agencies, and in occupational licensing, certification, and membership organizations, etc.

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Effective Date: July 1, 2015



#### HB 0985– Relating to Maintenance of Agency Final Orders Ch. 2015-155 Laws of Florida Approved by the Governor on June 11, 2015

The bill amends statutory language by:

- Requiring agencies to electronically transmit certain agency final orders to centralized electronic database maintained by DOAH;
- Revising provisions for searching & maintaining lists of final orders;
- Providing a timeframe for electronically transmitting or listing final orders;
- Providing that centralized electronic database are official compilations of final orders issued on or after certain date for each agency;
- Requiring DOS to set standards & guidelines for certifying, electronically transmitting, & ensuring security of copies of agency final orders;
- Authorizing alternative official compiler of agency final orders under certain circumstances.

#### Effective Date: July 1, 2015

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#### HB 7023 – Relating to Administrative Procedures Ch. 2015-162 Laws of Florida Approved by the Governor on June 11, 2015

The bill amends statutory language by:

- Revising the deadline to propose rules implementing new laws;
- Revising requirements for the annual review of agency rules;
- Repealing provisions relating to the legislative survey of regulatory impacts;
- Rescinding the suspension of rulemaking authority made under s. 120.745, F.S., etc.

Effective Date: July 1, 2015

#### <u>HB 7055</u> – Relating to Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles <u>Ch. 2015-163</u> Laws of Florida Approved by the Governor on June 11, 2015

- Revising provisions for funeral expenses for certain officers killed in line of duty;
- Revising provisions for flags displayed when load extends beyond vehicle;
- Revising provisions for permitting of overlength trailers;
- Revising provisions for the display of vehicles for sale, hire, or rent;
- Revising provisions for the pilot program for rebuilding inspection services;



- Revising provisions on options on application forms;
- Revising provisions for residential manufactured buildings on mobile home lots;
- Revising provisions for specialty & special license plates;
- Revising provisions for the disclosure of insurance policy numbers, & emergency allergy treatment.

#### Effective Date: October 1, 2015

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#### <u>SB 2504-A</u> – State Employees <u>Ch. 2015-223</u> Laws of Florida Approved by the Governor on June 23, 2015

The bill amends statutory language by:

- Providing for the resolution of certain collective bargaining issues at impasse between the State of Florida and certified bargaining units of state employees;
- Providing for all other mandatory collective bargaining issues at impasse that are not addressed by the act or the General Appropriations Act to be resolved consistent with personnel rules or by otherwise maintaining the status quo;

#### Effective Date: July 1, 2015, except as otherwise provided

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#### <u>SB 2512-A</u> – Employer Contributions to Fund Retiree Benefits <u>Ch. 2015-227</u> Laws of Florida Approved by the Governor on June 23, 2015

The bill amends statutory language by:

- Revising the employer contribution rates for the retiree health insurance subsidy;
- Revising the required employer retirement contribution rates for members of each membership class and subclass of the Florida Retirement System;
- Providing findings of an important state interest, etc;

#### Effective Date: July 1, 2015, except as otherwise provided

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### Penalty Bills

## The following is an overview of penalty bills of interest to the Department of Corrections passed by the Florida Legislature during the 2015 Regular Legislative Session.

#### HB 0133 – Relating to Sexual Offenses Ch. 2015-133 Laws of Florida Approved by the Governor on June 11, 2015

The bill amends statutory language by:

- Designating the act as the "43 Days Initiative Act";
- Revising time limitations for criminal prosecution of specified sexual battery offenses if victim is 16 years of age or older;
- Providing applicability.

#### Effective Date: July 1, 2015

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#### <u>SB 0538</u> – Relating to Sexual Cyberharassment <u>Ch. 2015-24</u> Laws of Florida Approved by the Governor on May 14, 2015

The bill amends statutory language by:

- Prohibiting a person from willfully and maliciously sexually cyberharassing another person;
- Authorizing a law enforcement officer to arrest, without a warrant, any person that he or she has probable cause to believe has committed sexual cyberharassment;
- Providing an exception to the prohibition on search warrants being issued to search private dwellings, etc;

#### Effective Date: October 1, 2015

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#### HB 0897 – Relating to Controlled Substances Ch. 2015-34 Laws of Florida Approved by the Governor on May 14, 2015

- Adding certain substances to Schedule I list of controlled substances;
- Re-enacting provisions.



#### HB 1127 – Relating to Insurance Fraud Ch. 2015-179 Laws of Florida Approved by the Governor on June 16, 2015

The bill amends statutory language by:

- Repealing provisions relating to operation or reporting of unlicensed health care clinics;
- Revising provisions related to certain health care clinic charges or reimbursement claims;
- Revising & providing criminal penalties for unlawful charges, operating or failing to report unlicensed clinic, filing false or misleading information related to clinic license application, & other violations;
- Repealing provisions relating to establishment of motor vehicle insurance fraud DSO.

#### Effective Date: October 1, 2015
