

2014 Annual Jail Capacity Survey

The Florida Department of Corrections and the Florida Legislature's Office of Economic and Demographic Research (EDR) (<http://edr.state.fl.us>) has requested participation in the 2014 Annual Jail Capacity Survey.

For the purposes of this survey, it is understood that a jail or prison facility's capacity is a volatile number. A facility's capacity can change while it adapts to provide the needs of a changing number of different groups of inmates. Please do not consider rare, special case, or worst case scenarios when proving your facility's capacity; please consider only scenarios involving normal, regularly occurring operating conditions.

The information in this survey was requested specifically by EDR, but is also provided to the community throughout the year via public records requests.

On October 28th the 2014 Jail Capacity Survey was emailed to all 67 counties throughout the state of Florida. The survey was provided through *Survey Monkey* ©, a web-based survey solution. Surveyors were also provided the option to complete the survey via telephone, fax, or email. Counties were given two weeks to complete the nine question survey in which time they were sent multiple email reminders and received numerous follow-up phone calls. After a month of data collection, 51 of the 67 counties completed the survey, with a response rate of 76%. A summary of the findings are as follows:

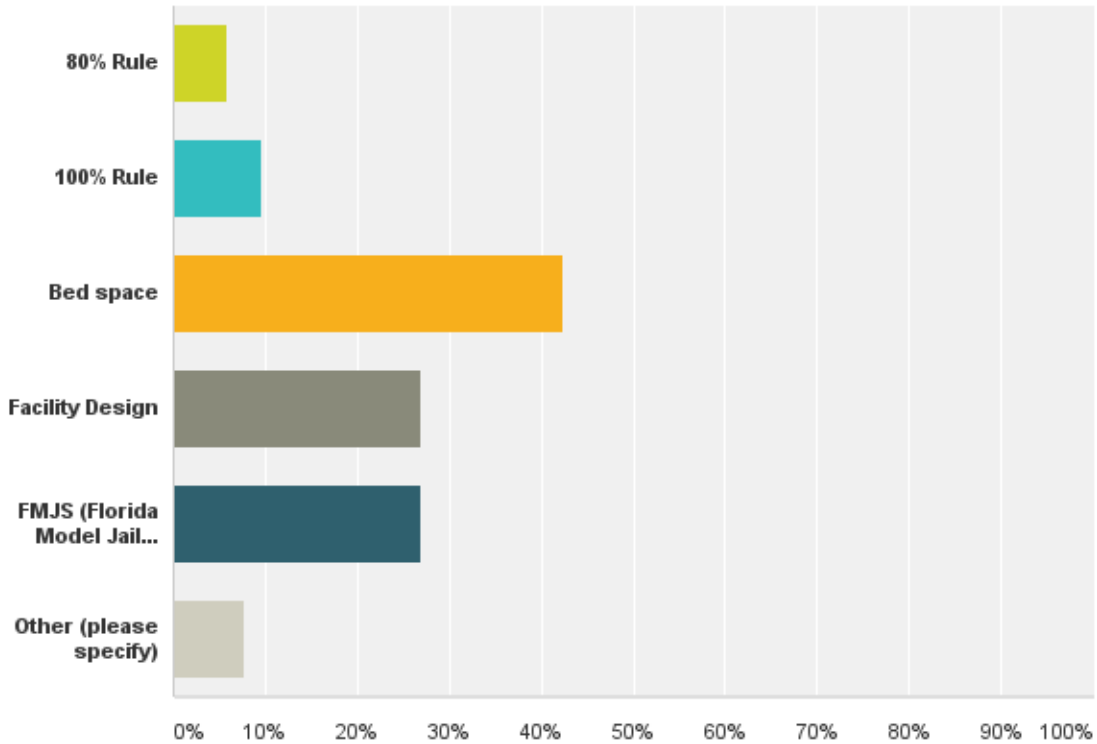

Florida County	Response
Miami-Dade	There have been some shifts in the housing locations for women and mentally ill inmates from one facility to another. This happened after June 30th.
Pinellas	Annex 1 and Annex 2 permanently closed and were removed from operational capacity - 374 Beds, which changed our capacity to 3,890.
